SAN ANTONIO PARK: SOMETHING TO CELEBRATE

Parks play integral roles in our communities.

They provide safe, fun places for our children to play. They preserve open space. They offer recreational opportunities for people of all ages, and they give us a chance to break away from the televisions, computer screens, and all those other distractions that keep us from enjoying the beauty around us.

There are scores and scores of wonderful parks throughout San Bernardino County, from neighborhood pocket parks, to urban City parks, to large County regional parks.

San Antonio Park in Upland is a great example of a park that's integrated open space, recreation, history and other amenities.

The park is also unique in that it serves residents in both the City of Upland and the unincorporated community of San Antonio Heights, which borders the park from the north.

A few years ago, the City of Upland embarked on a major expansion and improvement project at the park. The project grew the developed portion of the park from 6.5 to 14.5 acres and added a walking trail, picnic areas, trash containers, landscaping and restrooms.

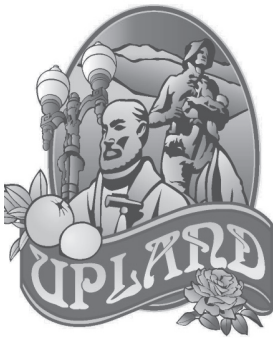
The City also restored the abandoned Ontario and San Antonio Heights Railroad Company wait station, which served as a stopping point for an electric streetcar that ferried residents from 24th Street to Holt Avenue in the late 1800s and early 1900s. A group of Boy Scouts from Troop 614 assisted with the restoration of the wait station.

As the Second District Supervisor, I was able to able to secure \$813,000 in County funding and \$150,000 in Prop. 40 park bond money to help the City complete the park project, which cost about \$2.8 million total.

On Saturday, April 19, the City is inviting the community to come out and celebrate the completion of improvements at San Antonio Park, which is located at on the corner of 24th Street and Mountain Avenue. The event – which will be held from noon to 2 p.m. – will feature food, entertainment and a bounce house for the youngster, and of course, there are loads of other activities to enjoy at the park. So please come out on April 19 and join in the celebration at San Antonio Park. It really is something to celebrate.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT)

The Association's Fire Safe Council was contacted by Supervisor Paul Biane's office at the end of 2007 and asked if they were interested in a CERT Training Program offered by San Bernardino County and coordinated by the Office of Emergency Training. Gary Crites, Chairperson of the Fire Safe Council, accepted the invitation and organized the first session which was held in January. Included in the program was what to do during and after disasters like earthquakes.



San Bernardino County firefighters also trained participants in survival and rescue skills, fire safety, response and triage. The team does not do life-saving tactics. The goal is to have residents capable of securing their own home and family first, then care for the neighbors and community.

A team of sixteen residents of San Antonio Heights participated in the Community Emergency Response program conducted by the San Bernardino County Fire Department.

Residents completed 21 hours of training during three seven-hour sessions. Yes, residents committed and gave up three Saturdays consecutively but all earned their certificates and a burning desire to continue with monthly training as a team to perfect their skills. This was a truly a diversified group of individuals ranging in age from twenties to sixties, from a variety of backgrounds, each bringing knowledge and experience to the group. The group was so enthusiastic, we could hardly get them to break for lunch even when being enticed with delicious pizza from our local Giuseppe's Restaurant.



Included also in the program were steps the team could take proactively until the arrival of emergency personnel. Fire safety, identifying and reducing potential fire risks, procedures for safe firefighting and hazardous materials identification were explained by Battalion Chief Barry Fox. Each was given the opportunity to use a fire extinguisher. Although there are instructions on the extinguisher, there is nothing more valuable than actually using one. The team was very receptive to learning how to reduce hazards in their own homes. Ways to share this information with all residents will be one of the Team's goals.



Captain John Flesher and Lt. Rich Solometo presented the training on disaster medical operations which included life threatening conditions, how to recognize and treat an airway obstruction, bleeding and shock. Team members worked on other members with fire personnel observing and helping as necessary. Conducting rescue operations was of major importance and the sessions were concluded "with a hands on" exercise and the team performing the rescue of fire personnel being the victims of an earthquake.

At a recent CERT meeting, the team tentatively assigned each member to a responsibility, i.e., team leader, administrative duties, drills, leadership development, section leaders, recruiting, supplies, etc. Also, each member will share at the next gathering any valuable tools that would be beneficial to add to the CERT backpack.

Although, we certainly hope San Antonio Heights will not encounter a disaster; if it does, this team is prepared and will work to be better prepared. Without any doubt, this was one of the most motivated, energetic and creative group of individuals I have worked with during my service in this community. Our time has not been wasted, much has been learned and I believe will be put in place in many of our every day lives.

Our thanks to the members of the Fire Safe Council Gary Crites, Mike Holzman, Donna Hawthorne, Dianne Allen and Cat Stines who spent many hours recruiting and putting this program together. SAN ANTONIO HEIGHTS WELCOME COMMITTEE

The San Antonio Heights Association and Citizens on Patrol have formed a ‘Welcome’ Committee to greet new residents to San Antonio Heights. Committee members will put together up-to-date information involving the community to give to existing and new residents. New residents will receive a basket with gifts and introductory discount coupons from many of the local businesses, i.e. Euclid Cleaners, Giuseppe’s Restaurant, Johnson Realty, Life Bible Fellowship Church, San Antonio Heights Community Church, Snow Crest Lodge, Valero Service Station/Mini-mart and Van Ness Water Gardens. The following information (in more detail) will be made available to all residents:

LOCAL EMERGENCY SERVICES

- **Emergency 9-1-1 Phone Calls** - Procedures on how to make emergency calls with a landline or cell phone from the Heights area will be explained as outlined by the San Bernardino County Communications Center.
- **Law Enforcement Protection** – Provided by San Bernardino County Sheriff’s Department through the Chino Hills Station. **DO NOT** call Upland Police. Non-emergency criminal activities should be reported to (909) 465-9789.
- **San Antonio Heights-Mt. Baldy Citizens On Patrol (COP)** – A volunteer program. The patrol car is housed at the garage north of Fire Station #12 at 24th and Euclid Avenue. Messages may be left at (909) 920-0204. The patrol provides random security checks on homes when requested by a resident. All security checks are documented. The community is brought together each year when COP holds its annual “George Lee Pancake Breakfast” Saturday before Memorial Day. COP always need volunteers to work. Shifts are four hours per week and volunteers are required to become familiar with the Heights and its residents.
- **California Highway Patrol** – Provides traffic control (909) 980-3994
- **Fire Service** is provided by **San Bernardino County Fire Services Station #12** located at 24th & Euclid Avenue. Station business number (909) 982-2611

WATER

- The San Antonio Water Company (SAWCo), a private mutual water company is located at 139 North Euclid Avenue, Upland, 91786-6036, (909) 982-4107. All property owners **MUST** have a minimum of one quarter (1/4) share of stock before water services can be provided.

ANIMAL CONTROL

- Services are provided by Inland Valley Humane Society at 500 Humane Lane, Pomona, Ca 91768. Phone (909) 623-9777

SAN ANTONIO HEIGHTS ASSOCIATION (SAHA)

- The Association was organized by a group of volunteers to assist residents in the resolution of homeowner or renter concerns and represents the constituency to the San Bernardino County Supervisor's office. The Board of Directors meet on the fourth Thursday at Life Bible Fellow Church, 7 p.m. All residents are welcome.

- The Association publishes the Gazette Newsletter quarterly and it is distributed by mail to ALL residents.
- A calendar of events is published on the website and a copy distributed with the informational packet.

- Septic sewer systems are installed at most San Antonio Heights homes. These systems will last a very long time if properly maintained. If not, extensive repairs can be expected. 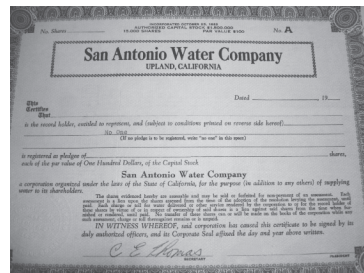

The Association has communicated numerous times with the U.S. Postal Service as shown in the letter below, however our response has not been favorable (see copy of email). We are in the process of contacting Congressman David Drier to see if he can offer some assistance. We will keep you posted.

RE: A Collection Mail Box for the San Antonio Heights area

Dear Ms. Collins:

I spoke with you on November 15, 2007 regarding replacement of the collection mail box previously located at the entrance of Albertsons grocery store located at 2419 North Euclid Avenue (above 24th Str). At that time, you said the postal service was in the process of completing a survey in which a determination would be made of the most “needed” mail boxes in Upland and you felt it should not be a problem to have one placed in San Antonio Heights. You asked me to check back with you on Tuesday, November 27, 2007 after the holiday and you would hopefully have an answer at that time.

I called back on November 29 and although you did not have results of the survey, I said the issue had again come up at our San Antonio Heights Association Annual Meeting and Mike Cloud, Pastor of the Life Bible Fellowship Church, had volunteered their property as a location for a collection mail box. We were thrilled that you did check this out but disappointed and understood your concerns about the safety of vehicles making “U” turns on Euclid. At that time you said there would be further research to locate a spot for a collection mail box and you would let me know.

I have called numerous times, left messages (some with personnel and a couple on your voice mail) and spoken to you on one occasion in which you said you would get back to me.

Our Association has had many inquiries as to when or if can expect a collection mail box in the Heights. We are sure you are aware of numerous thefts from personal mailboxes that have occurred in San Antonio Heights. We constantly suggest to our residents that they DO NOT put outgoing mail (especially checks) in their personal mail boxes and are aware that our closest postal service is located at 16th Street and Mountain Avenue.

Although I do not know the specifics of your evaluation of a mail box at Life Bible Fellowship Church, the question was posed if consideration was given to having the mail box located at the office entrance office where residents would drive into the parking lot and get out of their vehicles to drop off mail, much as they did at the Albertsons store.

Gloria, we are hopeful you will be able to help us with a solution to this concern. We would like very much to keep our residents informed on when and where we can expect collection mail box in our area as we had before. Donna,

I am sorry I have not returned your message, at this time I cannot put in any additional collection boxes. I am not expecting to put one in any time soon. Our density tests did not indicate that the boxes we currently have in place in the Northern area of Upland are utilized to their potential.

Currently we have three collection points each less than two miles apart.

Regretfully, I delegated the duties to respond to your inquiries to one of my managers and upon review, the letter was very brief, only indicating the nearest three collection boxes in the vicinity. It did not explain that we are unable to fund further collection points at this time.

I apologize for the lack of follow up.
